

ANTI-SODOMY REPEALER

Health Omnibus (SF2909) has a provision that repealed Minnesota's anti-sodomy permanently from law permanently. The law had been unenforceable in Minnesota since 2001 and nationally since 2003; but, codifying it into law prevents any attempts to use it to discriminate with legal recourse.

The bill also repealed outdated laws regarding fornication, adultery, and abortion restrictions.

WHAT THE LAW DOES:

- Repeals the anti-sodomy law and other outdated laws
- Removes criminal and other penalties for same-sex relationships
